

LIGHTING OPERATOR

A Lighting Operator programs and cues lighting at appropriate times during gathering and event. This position supports the look and feel of the experience in the gathering or event. No experience is necessary; training will be provided.

Expectation: A Lighting Operator will understand the basic operation of the lighting software, different types of light fixtures, and what type of lighting is expected for Evergreen's culture upon completion of training. Lighting Operators must have training at Evergreen prior to serving on their own during a gathering or event. A Lighting Operator will be familiar with the flow of gatherings or events prior to the scheduled serve date. Familiarity with outlined music in the gathering flow is also required. This information can be found by logging into Planning Center Services

Commitment: Serve a minimum of one time a month, but no more than three times a month for Sunday volunteer positions. All other weekly gatherings or events can be as often as a volunteer would like. A volunteer must attend rehearsals for gatherings and events as scheduled. Typically rehearsals are on the same day as the gathering. There may be additional rehearsals for seasonal events.

Training: Training for this position will begin with production staff or another production volunteer. Volunteers will be shown the basic operation of the lighting software, location of light fixtures on catwalks and stage, types of light fixtures, how the light fixtures operate, and haze usage in the Main Auditorium. The training times will happen at a separate scheduled time and/or during gatherings to begin practicing navigating the software and program appropriate lighting. Production staff will determine when a volunteer is ready to operate lighting on their own and then be scheduled regularly.
